R. L. Hatchett (Ph.D., Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary) is Professor of Theology and Philosophy at Houston Baptist University. His areas of teaching include Hermeneutics, and Systematic and Historical Theology.

Dr. Hatchett served Baker Baptist Church, near Weatherford, as pastor for 5 years.
